## **LIVE EARTH ACQUIRES RAIL-SERVED LANDFILL AND TRANSFER STATION**

CLEVELAND, OH — Live Earth LLC today announced it has acquired Sunny Farms Landfill, located in Fostoria, Ohio, and Champion City Recovery, located in Brockton, Massachusetts. The acquisition was completed in late 2007.

“This acquisition gives Live Earth the opportunity to provide a responsible, cost effective solid waste disposal option for high population areas throughout the Northeastern United States” said Christopher Valerian, president and chief executive officer for Live Earth. “This market represents over 40 million people with a combined annual solid waste generation of over 60 million tons. Live Earth also intends to expand its presence in the Ohio market.”

According to Valerian, the acquisition makes Live Earth one of the few fully integrated, independent, nonhazardous solid waste rail disposal companies in the Northeast United States.

Live Earth will operate one of the largest fleets of rail cars in its market and ship waste from Champion City Recovery or from third party shippers to Sunny Farms Landfill, its own Subtitle-D, direct Class I railroad-served MSW facility.

“We look forward to providing exceptional service to our customers, as well as developing partnerships with the communities wherein we do business,” said Valerian

Financial details of the acquisition were not disclosed.

Live Earth LLC is a newly formed entity organized for the purpose of acquiring Sunny Farms Landfill and Champion City Recovery.
